Canarian Sweetness

English, is an alcoholic beverage originating from the Canary Islands, often given as a free shot when paying the bill in restaurants. Crafted with expertise, this unique drink is a harmonious blend of two key ingredients: rum and honey.

Ron Miel, which translates to "Honey Rum" in

The distinctive flavor profile is both sweet and smooth, displaying hues ranging from antique gold to intense mahogany. Historical records suggest that Ron Miel's origins trace back to the 7th century. During that period, blending rum with honey or fruit gained popularity, enhancing the drinkability of rum. Now, what exactly is it?

Rum or Liqueur?

When it comes to Ron Miel, the distinction between and liqueur is intriguing. With a maximum alcohol percentage of 30%. falling below the minimum 37.5% required for rum, it technically fits the profile of a honey liqueur. Despite aligning more with the liqueur category by European standards, Canarian producers have retained the original "Ron Miel" nomenclature. Interestingly, in Italy and other regions producing honey-infused rum, the label "rum and honey liqueur" is mandatory. To earn the title of authentic Ron Miel. a minimum of 2% bee honey must be infused into the rum.

Whether you classify it as rum or liqueur, one fact remains - it's a beloved and popular beverage. And for those enthusiasts looking to recreate this delightful drink at home, we've got a recipe for you.

How to make:

750 ml rum - 250 grams of honey 1 lemon - 1 cinnamon stick half a vanilla pod

Pour the honey into the rum and mix so that the ingredients dissolve into a single solution. Slice the zest of the lemon very thinly and add it to the mixture along with the vanilla and cinnamon sticks. Put the mixture in a container in a dark and cool place. Let it rest for at least 48 hours. Remove the lemon zest, cinnamon, and vanilla pod and filter the remaining liquid.

> Try Ron Miel with a dollop of whipped cream and cinnamon. Cheers to homemade indulgence!



Rock Cafe | Corralejo



This unique shoreline boasts a remarkable "sand" that closely resembles puffed-up popcorn. However, these kernels are not your typical beach sand; they are actually composed of coral fossils -calcareous algae- that have washed ashore.

Geological Wonder

These petite formations are scientifically known as "rhodoliths." The fascinating geological spectacle that shapes Popcorn Beach is the result of countless centuries of natural processes. Erosion, tides, and volcanic activities have all played their part in crafting this extraordinary landscape. Over time, the the ocean has meticulously polished these corals, bestowing upon them their distinctive shape and texture.

It's noteworthy that these rhodoliths grow underwater at an astonishing rate of just one millimeter per year. Therefore, when you encounter a section measuring 25 centimeters, you are witnessing a formation that has been developing for an impressive 250 years.

Ecological value

While it's perfectly acceptable to capture memories with these "popcorn" formations, it is strictly prohibited to take any of them with you and may incur penalties. This prohibition is rooted in the profound ecological value of these

coral granules. Moreover, the cavities within these corals serve as homes for the eggs of various marine creatures. Over time, these cavities erode, contributing to the formation of beach sand. Former President of Fuerteventura Sergio Lloret made a heartfelt appeal, emphasizing, "It is increasingly common to take a souvenir from the beaches of Fuerteventura, without knowing that every time a person takes a shell or other material, they are contributing to the imbalance of that ecosystem and, therefore, to the loss of biodiversity."

Must visit?

Yes! Popcorn Beach is an absolute natural wonder that deserves a place on your list of must-visit destinations. Its charm makes it an ideal stop, even though it's not your typical beach for swimming or sunbathing..

Please note

At Fuerteventura airport, officials diligently confiscate any sand, stones, or shells found in travelers' luggage. Expert staff are tasked with identifying the origin of these geological materials, and up to 600 kilograms of such materialsare returned to the beaches and other locations on the island every month.



Ajuy, also known as Puerto de la Peña, is a delightful fishing village adorned with charming whitewashed houses, inviting fresh fish eateries, and, importantly, it has preserved its authentic charm, avoiding excessive tourist development. A true gem, providing a glimpse into local life and a peaceful atmosphere that is increasingly rare to find.

Ajuy has fine volcanic sand and formidable waves. Unfortunately, it carries the haunting moniker, *Playa de Los Muertos* - Beach of the Dead - due to the historical occurrence of drowned individuals brought there by powerful sea currents.

While it may not immediately appear as the most scenic spot in Fuerteventura, there's an unique charm to this place.

Oldest land in the Canary Islands

The *Cuevas de Ajuy -* Ajuy caves; are truly extraordinary. They hold significance as the oldest remnants of land in the Canary Islands and stand as the deepest caves in the

region. Their geological origins precede the formation of the island of Fuerteventura itself, making





them authentic natural relics. Surprisingly, this fact remains relatively unknown to the general public, representing a missed opportunity. These caves deserve greater recognition among visitors as a genuine geological wonder. Exploring rocks that are over 10,000 centuries old, emerging from depths of about 3,000 meters in the oceanic crust to rise above sea level, is a rare and unusual occurrence that shouldn't be overlooked.

According to the International Union of Geological Sciences, the presence of various igneous and volcanic sediments has earned Ajuy a place among the 150 areas of exceptional geological significance worldwide. This distinction led to its designation as a Natural Monument. But that's not all; it's also steeped in history and legend. Many pirates who sailed these waters reportedly hid their treasure here.

Moreover, in 1402, Ajuy was the strategic location chosen by Jean de Béthencourt for his invasion and conquest of the island, adding another layer of historical intrigue to this fascinating place.

Mirador de Ajuy

Embarking on the ascent towards the caves, you'll encounter the *Mirador de Ajuy* - a perfect vantage point for capturing breathtaking photos of the beach and the expansive ocean.

Immediately, you'll be captivated by intriguing dunes sculpted by erosion, composed of marine gastropod fossils and oceanic sediments. With the right tide, witness the sea surging into the blowholes, forcefully expelling water in a thunderous spectacle.

Lime kilns

The next noteworthy attraction includes two lime kilns integral to lime production, a crucial resource for whitewashing houses and a significant Majorero trade. Lime from these kilns was shipped to Gran Canaria and Tenerife from the adjacent pier, visible as you descend the stairs leading halfway to the caves. The remaining concrete beams served as supports for a ramp used to lower and load goods onto boats, providing splendid views of the cliffs.

Caves

Upon reaching the end of the path, you'll find a staircase leading down to the caves. Stepping inside is akin to a journey back to a prehistoric era. The caves boast colossal dimensions, and with a flashlight in hand, you can venture into some of the tunnels, exploring to significant depths.

After your exploration of these remarkable caves, it's highly advised to stay and witness the renowned sunset. Seated on such ancient soil, you'll likely experience the same feeling that the Mahos did centuries ago.

Nestled in the hills of the Betancuria Massif lies the Canary Islands' oldest town and Fuerteventura's historic heart:


Betancuria

Its old center, perched on a slope, stands as a unified historical monument.

The first capital of Fuerteventura

Betancuria served as Fuerteventura's first capital after Jean de Bethencourt's conquest of the island for Spain. Strategically located away from the coast to evade pirates, it thrived with a river providing essential water. Although intended for an archbishop who never arrived, it was for a long time the only congregation with a cathedral.

However, Betancuria faced adversity, suffering attacks by Berber pirates that left the town, including the cathedral, in ruins. Despite this, Betancuria resiliently rebuilt its place of worship and retained its administrative significance until 1834. Eventually, economic activity shifted to the east coast, leading to Betancuria's decline.



Archaeological and Ethnographic Museum

The Museo de Betancuria, marked by two cannons confiscated from British invaders in 1740, delves into the Canary Islands' early European expeditions, Majoreros' material culture, and the prehistoric world. Notable archaeological finds include bones, fertility statues, pottery, and tools.



Ancient Monastery

To the north, you'll discover the remains of the Convento San Buenaventura chapel and monastery complex, built in the early 15th century. This site, which played a pivotal role in converting the island's population to Roman Catholicism, now stands forgotten and dilapidated.

Pine forest

Surprisingly, Fuerteventura boasts a forest - a result of reforestation efforts. The Zona Recreativa de Betancuria, a small pine forest with a picnic area and playground, lies between Betancuria and Vega de Río Palmas. Despite its differences from lush northern European forests, it's a popular spot for locals to relax.





The Canarian Islands, known today as a Spanish autonomous community, has a rich and ancient history that precedes its incorporation into Spain. Before the arrival of Spanish conquistadors, the Canarian Islands were inhabited by indigenous people who had their own names for these beautiful landmasses.

Let's journey back in time to uncover the ancient names of these islands and the civilizations that once thrived upon them.

Tenerife - Achineche

The name Tenerife is known to have two components, which, are believed to result from reading or printing errors: "Tener" meaning snow and "Fe" meaning mountain. Historians believe that these names were bestowed by its inhabitants, presumably when they gazed upon the snow-capped Teide in the distance. Others convey this information, mentioning that the natives referred to the island as Achinech. The Guanches called their island Achineche at the end of the 16th century, but the name that the people of La Palma gave it, Tenerife, ultimately prevailed.

Gran Canaria - Canaria

Traditionally, people have been told, that the name *Canaria* is

linked to the presence of dogs on the islands. Chroniclers attest that there were "some wild dogs" in "Gran Canaria," resembling wolves but smaller in size.

The persistent claim that "Tamarán" is the pre-Conquest name for Gran Canaria is based on a misconception. This term is falsely attributed to the island's indigenous history. It was actually invented by the pseudo-historian Manuel Osuna Saviñón from Tenerife in the midnineteenth century.

La Palma - Benahoare

La Palma, often referred to as "La Isla Bonita" (The Beautiful Island), had the ancient name Benahoare which translates to homeland in the language of the indigenous people of the island.

Unveiling the Ancient Names of the Canary

Fuerteventura - Erbania or Maxorata

Fuerteventura was known as *Erbania* in the language of the Guanches. This name may have been derived from the word *"erban,"* which means desert or dry land, though its autochthonous origin remains uncertain.


Lanzarote - Tyterogata

Lanzarote was known as *Tyterogata* reflecting the island's volcanic origins and the challenges its early inhabitants faced in adapting to its unique environment.

La Gomera - Gomera

La Gomera, in contrast to some other islands, retained a name very similar to its ancient designation.

The island was known as *Comera*, a name that has persisted through the centuries. Historians suggest that the Africans bestowed this name upon the island when they settled there.

El Hierro - Eseró or Efero

El Hierro, the smallest and westernmost of the Canary Islands, was referred to as *Eseró* by the Guanches. This name hints at the island's rugged and untamed nature.

Even after the conquest of Gran Canaria in 1483, the term "Canarian" continued to be used to describe the people of the islands, although each island's natives had their own distinct names:

- Maxos or Mahos referred to those from Lanzarote and Fuerteventura.
- · Canaries denoted those from Gran Canaria.
- · Guanches were the people of Tenerife.
- Gomeros La Gomera.
- · Auritas were the inhabitants of La Palma.
- · Bimbaches were those from El Hierro.

These ancient names provide a glimpse into the diverse cultures and languages that flourished in the Canary Islands long before they became a part of Spain.

While the names may have changed, the Canarian Islands continue to be a place of unique beauty, culture, and history. Exploring these ancient names allows us to appreciate the rich tapestry of civilizations that once called these islands home, leaving a lasting legacy that still resonates in the vibrant culture of the Canaries today.

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



Charcos

Charcos, meaning "puddles" or "pools" in Spanish, are rock formations sculpted by the power of the Atlantic Ocean over countless centuries. While many of these treasures remain hidden and challenging to access, we've uncovered six charcos that are within reach, inviting you to experience their beauty.



Charco Playa de la Mujer

Along the coast near Tindaya lies Playa de la Mujer, a spot favored by both locals and tourists alike. As the tides recede, a natural pool is formed, sheltered from the ocean's waves by volcanic rocks.

Playa de los Charcos El Cotillo

El Cotillo is another hotspot for natural swimming pools. Here you can explore a series of pools that vary in size and depth. The calm waters and surroundings make it a haven for families seeking a day by the sea.



Charco Caleta de Fuste

Just north of Caleta de Fuste, this hidden gem graces the coastline. Reaching this tranquil haven involves a bit of climbing and scrambling, but the reward is a refreshing dip in the pristine waters.

Charco de Aguas Verdes

A chance to enjoy a leisurely swim in a breathtaking setting. Its waters remain impeccably clear, thanks to the constant renewal by the lapping waves.

Charcos de Ajuy

Apart from the intriguing caves and the alluring black sand beach, Ajuy boasts the presence of stunning charcos which also require a bit of climbing and scrambling, but with sturdy footwear and the freedom to use both hands, it's a manageable adventure.

Roque del Moro Cofete

Tucked away in the heart of Jandia Natural Park, identifiable by a rock formation at the terminus of the 14-kilometerlong beach. To access this gem, you can embark on an off-road drive along a rugged path or opt for a 3-kilometer hike through a small canyon.



Safety first

Understanding that charcos reveal their splendor during low tide is key. Thus, it's essential to monitor the tide conditions before and during your visit. While some charcos may seem shallow, it's wise to keep a watchful eye on children.

Respecting nature's gifts

These natural swimming pools are fragile ecosystems. Please avoid leaving any litter behind, and respect the local flora and fauna. Many of these pools are not well-marked, so it's advisable to check local guides or seek advice from residents to locate them safely.

Whether you're looking for a spot to relax or an adventurous journey to reach hidden gems, these pools offer a truly immersive experience.

While Fuerteventura may appear arid and desolate, appearances can be deceiving.

This island boasts the highest number of bird species across the entire Canary archipelago.
Consequently, it holds significant importance for scientific research and conservation efforts, with almost 300 species of endemic, migratory, and nesting birds along its coastal and inland regions.




Feathered beauties

Much like Africa's 'big five' are a highlight for safaris, Fuerteventura offers the 'big five' for birdwatchers: The Fuerteventura chat (Saxicola dacotiae), the Corredor Sahariano (Cursorius cursor), the Canarian Houbara (Chlamydotis undulata fuertaventurae), the Canary Blue Tit (Cyanistes teneriffae) and the Black bellied Sandgrouse (Pterocles orientalis).

We would like to add the Canary Egyptian Vulture, the Trumpeter bullfinch and the Hoopoe to this list, as spotting these birds is an absolute joy.

From the shy Cream-colored Courser to the colorful Fuerteventura chat and from the impressive Egyptian vulture to the endangered Canary Blue Tit - all these feathered beauties make Fuerteventura their home.









DID YOU KNOW?

Besides this cute little bird, Caldereta is also the name of a smal village in the municipality of La Oliva and the meaning of the word translated to English, is 'stew'. If you ever see "Caldereta de cordero" somewhere on the menu, you will not get this bird on your plate, but a goat meat stew.

We need to sail or go crazy!

Corky, you're a professional windsurfer. How did you get started?

I started back home in Newcastle, UK. I was always at the beach when there was a storm. Practicing, even all through the winter months, with snow on the beaches.

How did you manage to make it your profession?

It all happened slowly. I was training all the time in Newcastle and even lived in Tarifa, Southern Spain, for a year in my van to get better in strong winds. I slowly picked up help from shops and sponsors as I trained and tried to get photos in the UK windsurf mags as often as I could.

Like in any profession things are going on behind the scenes - it's not just surfing, right?

It's basically a job to me. There's so much involved behind the scenes. People don't get that. Your sponsors require a lot of feedback and regular photoshoots of all the latest gear. Now, with social media, Instagram, Facebook e.g everything has developed. The contracts tell you what is expected:

press releases, trips, photos, and weekly updates on social media of you in action on or off the water. Basically, selling all the gear to potential customers on and off the beach. I'm super lucky that I have been fully sponsored for a long time now, but I have worked hard to get to this point. It doesn't come freely. My latest International sponsor, @rrdwatersports, stepped in to make me an ambassador to promote them recently on my annual photoshoot to Tiree, Scotland. Now I'm home in Fuerteventura to carry on the advertising daily at all the hot spots we have here.

What is your biggest challenge being a pro windsurfer?

I think the biggest challenge is always being on standby to go. When the conditions are good, we need to sail or go crazy! Staying fit and injury-free is super important, too

Your best windsurfing experience(s)?

I had far too many insane experiences. I've never been a competition sailor. I prefer to freesail, enjoy, and concentrate on getting good photos. Being British Expression Champion 3x, for sure, helped me gain deals with sponsors, but it's the free sailing

that makes me happy. Sailing new spots with friends and special trips like Puerto Rico, The Shacks, Ireland - Brandon Bay, Jameos del Aqua, Tiree Inner Hebrides in Scotland.

Your worst windsurfing experience(s)?

My worst experience was being stuck on the outside at El Cotillo one winter. The waves were too big to sail back in... They were up to 8 meters. I had to wait for a lull in the sets and sail in as quick as possible, with no room for error. That one I will never forget.

What do you like to do besides windsurfing?

When there's no wind, rest!!! I love to fish on my paddleboard when there's no wind. Paddle boarding also keeps cardio up.

What is the most significant misconception people have about windsurfing?

Misconception about windsurfing... mmm... Maybe that it's for people who can't surf, but most of us do or started with surfing. Also, maybe that it's an expensive sport, but to start off, if you want to learn it, you can buy all the gear anywhere really cheaply nowadays.

Why Fuerteventura? Are you going to stay? Any plans for the future?

Fuerteventura was always the place I intended to go to. I still remember I only had photos of Fuerte beaches - El Cotillo, shooting gallery, Glass beach... - on my bedroom walls. It's surreal that I'm still here and yes, I intend to stay! Why not...

Anything you would like to say to our readers?

You only have one life, so if you want to move abroad or live here, you can. Just plan it and make your dreams come true. I did it. FUERTEVENTURA really is a water sports paradise! Of course, I would like to thank all my sponsors @rrdwatersports @vwcanarias @dakine_wind @secretoenergy @k4fins @geckoheadgear and @mission.info for their support!
